NAME	DESCRIPTION	COLOR	DAYS TO MATURITY
Amish Paste	Indeterminate, red fruits averaging 8-12 oz. vary in shape from oxheart to plum. Excellent for sauce or fresh eating.	Red	85
Beef Steak	Fruits are deep red, smooth-skinned, meaty and juicy with an average weight < 2 lbs. Indeterminate vines have excellent disease resistance resulting in yields nearly double that of other beefsteak varieties.	Red	80
Black Krim	Indeterminate heirloom tomato bearing 8-16 oz. flattened globe fruits that are dark reddish-purple to black with green/brown shoulders.	Dark reddish purple	70-90
Blondkopfchen	Indeterminate. Plant produces heavy yields of 1/2 to 1 oz golden yellow cherry tomatoes. One of the best tasting cherry tomatoes. Perfect fresh eating right off the vine or in salads. Grow in clusters of 20 to 30 tomatoes. Crack resistant	Yellow	75-80
Brandywine	Indeterminate. The potato-leaf plants produce large 8-12 oz. fruits that are oblate in shape and pink in color. Excellent flavor.	Red	80
Chef's Choice	F-1 hybrid. Plant produces high yields of 8-12 oz. bright orange beefsteak tomatoes. They have very good flavor and texture. The tomato does not lose its bright orange color when cooked, thus great for soups and sauces. Perfect for sandwiches, salads, and slicing. Low acidity variety. Crack resistant.	Orange	75
Cherokee Purple	Indeterminate, 12-16 oz. dark pink-purple fruits have an excellent complex flavor, slightly sweet aftertaste, perfect for slicing.	Dark pink/purple	75-80
Czech Stupice (Stu-peach-ka)	Indeterminate plants with potato leaf foliage are early to yield, making them delicious candidates for northern gardens. Plant produces red, small to medium sized fruits over a very long season. Highly popular in areas with short summers.	Red	55-70
Geranium Kiss	Hybrid. Stocky, determinate, dwarf plants, with rugose foliage, grow just 24-30" high and produce loads of golf ball sized, bright red fruits that are round with pointed ends. Tomatoes have a good texture, and exceptional flavor and grow in clusters of 10 or more and weigh about 1 ounce each.	Red	65
German Johnson	Indeterminate, 8 - >16 oz. fruits with smooth tops, good for slicing & canning with few seeds. Very productive and fairly resistant to disease.	Pink/Red	80-90
Martino's Roma	Determinate. A very impressive variety that is extremely productive and disease free. Totally free of blossom end rot. The dark red fruit are 3-4 oz and produced in clusters and are perfect for paste, sauce or salsa. Highly recommended.	Dark Red	75
Mexico Midget	Indeterminate. Hundreds of 1/2"-3/4" dark red cherry tomatoes on each plant. Huge tomato flavor for such small fruits. Great for salads or selling in pints. Plants produce throughout the entire growing season.	Red	60-70
Midnight Snack	Indeterminate hybrid. AAS winner 2017 – Vining habit bears heavily all summer. Grows in clusters of 4-8 fruit. High in antioxidants.	Dark purple/black	65-70
Mortgage Lifter	Indeterminate. Kentucky family heirloom grown since the 1930s. Crops of 1-2 lb. pink beefsteak fruits. Meaty, typically crack-free, with great old-fashioned flavor	Pink	80-90

Old Brooks	Indeterminate. This old heirloom is a beefsteak type, with fruits averaging 6-8 oz. with some disease resistance. The deep, red fruit is blemish free, has few seeds, a small core and is fine tasting, with a slightly acidic flavor.	Red	78
Opalka	Indeterminate. Shaped like elongated plum tomatoes. 4-6 oz. fruits are packed with great tomato taste. Ideal for salsa and sauces.	Red	85
Prudens Purple	Indeterminate. Exceptionally early for a large tomato. Average fruit weighs 10-16 oz., is 4 inches across, and 3 inches high. Distinctive ridges, like the ribs of a cantaloupe, gird the fruit longitudinally. The color is more of a deep pink than a true purple. Flesh is firm and meaty and the flavor is wonderful. Very few seeds.	Pink/red	75
Russian Persimmon	Determinate rose-orange (persimmon colored) fruits range from 4-8 oz. Meaty, very sweet, and few seeds. Vigorous and prolific	Yellow/orange	75-80
San Marzano	Indeterminate plum tomato variety. The fruits are thin and pointy in shape and have few seeds. A great paste tomato with a bright red color and heavy walls - great for sauce and ketchup.	Red	80
Sungold	Indeterminate. F-1 hybrid Exceptionally sweet, bright tangerine-orange cherry tomatoes. Vigorous plants start yielding early and bear right through the season.	Orange	57
Yugo Pink	Indeterminate, regular-leaf tomato plants that yield large amounts of up to 1 lb. fruits. Pink beefsteak tomatoes that are full-flavored, deliciously juicy. Crack-resistant tomato variety.	Pink	70-90
